What aspirations do they currently have for themselves, their families, and the community? Hopefully, this meeting will result not only in knowing each other better, but in continuing dialogue over time, improving communication, and building trust and friendships. Mission Trip to Haiti

Experience Haiti on a mission trip May 27 - June 3 with Community Coalition for Haiti (CCH). Unity member and CCH staffer, Kate Conrad, will lead a team interested in learning more about Haiti and CCH. This trip is open to anyone. Team members will help Haitian doctors and nurses run school-based health clinics for students at two of CCH's partner schools. There is a special need for doctors, nurses, and healthcare professionals to staff these student clinics. Non-medical volunteers are also needed to help with clinics, vacation Bible school, and small (low-tech) construction projects. If you have other skills (education, agriculture, leadership training, etc.), new projects may be arranged during this week based these skills.

Lakewood Care Center Need

In 2015, we became aware that Lakewood residents did not have television service in their rooms and there was no working television in the common area. So, the Lakewood TV Project began. Funds were raised to purchase and install 12 flat-screen televisions in dual-occupancy rooms and the cost of DirecTV service for a year. The program was so successful it has continued. The current DirecTV contract ends March 19, 2018, and more than half of the \$150 cost per room has been raised. Unity Mission funds and Presbyterian Women of Unity have each volunteered to sponsor service for a room.
